Brickwork Level 1 Diploma - 1 Year

Entry Requirements

Four GCSEs Grade 9 – 2, including Maths and English Language.

What will I learn on this course?

The course will cover topics including:

- Setting out up to Damp Proof Course
- Block laying skills
- Bricklaying skills
- Cavity wall construction
- Health and Safety practices related to the workplace
- How to calculate materials used in the process of bricklaying
- How to construct different types of wall

You will complete a number of practical projects and assessments. There are also end of unit assessments which are completed online.

What will this course lead on to?

The successful completion of this Bricklaying course could lead to progression on to the Level 2 Diploma or an Apprenticeship.

Brickwork Level 2 Diploma - 1 Year

Entry Requirements

Successful completion of a Level 1 Diploma in Bricklaying or 4 GCSE grades at grade 9 – 3 including Maths and English.

What will I learn on this course?

The course will cover topics including:

- · Bricklaying skills
- Solid walling and cavity walling
- Piers and attached piers
- Safe working practices
- Communication with others
- Information relating to quantities
- During the course all learners will be expected to gain between 45-60 days' work experience in order to make the transition to the workplace as smooth as possible

What will this course lead on to?

The successful completion of the Brickwork course could lead to a Level 3 Diploma or possible Apprenticeship programme.





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
