Joinery Level 1 Diploma - 1 Year

Entry Requirements

Four GCSEs Grade 9 – 2, including Maths and English Language.

What will I learn on this course?

The course will cover topics including:

- Building methods and construction
- Working with hand and power tools
- Producing basic joinery items
- The preparation of different materials and a full selection of timber joints
- Communication skills required for today's workplace
- Safe working practices
- Information, quantities and communication with others

What will this course lead on to?

On successful completion of this course, you could progress to the Level 2 Diploma Carpentry and Joinery. Alternatively, you could also apply for an electrical apprenticeship.

Carpentry and Joinery Level 2 Diploma - 1 Year

Entry Requirements

Four GCSEs Grade 9 – 3 including Maths, English Language. Or the successful completion of a Level 1 Diploma in Joinery plus English Language and Maths at grade 9 – 3.

What will I learn on this course?

The course will cover topics including:

- Safe working practices
- Information, quantities and communication with others
- Building methods and construction
- Roofing and flooring
- Stairs and kitchens
- Skirting boards, architravesDoor frames, doors and
- windows

As part of the course you will produce several pieces of practical work to be assessed that will demonstrate your ability and allow you to progress.

What will this course lead on to?

On successful completion of this course, you could progress to the Level 3 Advanced Diploma in Carpentry and Joinery. Alternatively, you could also apply for an apprenticeship.

Carpentry and Joinery Level 3 Advanced Diploma - 1 Year

Entry Requirements

You must have successfully completed Level 2 Diploma in Carpentry and Joinery and GCSE Grade 4 or Level 2 in English Language and Maths.

What will I learn on this course?

The course will cover topics including:

- Carry out second fixing
- Erect complex structural carcassing components
- Maintain non-structural and structural components
- Set up and use fixed and transportable machinery
- Information, quantities and communicating with others
- Building methods and construction technology
- Carry out first fixing operations

What will this course lead on to?

This course can gain you employment as a Joiner on a construction site. Some learners progress into higher education to study site management.
