The courses within the school offer a wide variety of enrichment activities which include national and international trips (AOC Regional/National events, Barcelona/France/New York), where students are given the opportunity to enhance their knowledge and understanding of Physical Education Curriculums and Public Service provision.

Opportunities for research, which supports many of the courses within the school, are particularly relevant and current. Students are visited by guest speakers from various organisations and public services, who often set workshops and assignments based on current issues throughout the curriculum areas. Close links have been made with many key providers and universities within the area; including Staffordshire University, Bolton University, Liverpool John Moores, Widnes Vikings, Halton Sport Development, AOC Sport, Merseyside Police, Blue Light Services, Uniformed Services, NHS, Voluntary Organisations and local Primary and Secondary Schools.

The school runs a gifted and talented Centre of Sporting Excellence programme where high-level sports performers can apply for scholarships and bursaries to support both their academic studies and sport progression; students also have opportunities to attain the Duke of Edinburgh qualifications. The department has excellent links to local partnerships and high schools, which give the students and prospective pupils the opportunity to participate in extracurricular activities a regular competition including: COSE Netball/Football/Rugby/ AOC Competitions/Coaching Master Classes/Gym Based Conditioning.
